BOOKS WITHOUT BORDERS

In an effort to include Spanish-speaking parents in their children's English-language arts and literacy studies, this project bridges the communication barrier by compiling a library of bilingual and multicultural books which may be taken home and shared by the family. BOUNTIFUL BOTANICAL GARDENS

Students will have a unique opportunity to explore the complex relationships between the life cycle of plants and the environment around them by researching, designing and cultivating their own botanical garden on school grounds. This program is an altruistic initiative that teams special education students with peers from the Business and Fine Arts Academies in a creative

entrepreneurial venture. Students in a Community-Based Vocational Training program will prepare and sell cookies, coffee and personally designed ceramic cups, molded from plaster and glazed under the guidance of fine arts students. Meanwhile, business students will prepare marketing and business plans for the coffee cup distribution. While the student mentors practice their specialties, the working collaboration will also provide the opportunity to develop supportive friendships with people with disabilities.

ENERGIZE YOUR VOICE

LET'S GO SOLAR

Re-establishing our local luminary as more than a South Beach tourist draw, this project offers a radiant look at solar power to gifted science students investigating alternative energy resources and technologies for the future. After researching the expensive production methods and global-warming effects of currently used fossil fuels, students will design and construct a model solar house, then craft solar automobiles to experiment and gather data on the advantages and disadvantages of solar power. Students will then contrast their scientific findings with laissez-faire reality, exploring the political and corporate challenges and obstacles to alternative fuel.

ROBOTIC LOCAL POSITIONING GUIDANCE SYSTEMS

Nobody likes a robot with no direction. This project groups five teams of senior avionic students to alleviate that problem. Using the Local Guidance System technology, students will draw from science, engineering, and computer programming to design, assemble, and program a robot to navigate a formidable obstacle course. After conducting research to develop their creations, programming code for the system, and building the robot, students will write algorithms to help the robots traverse the shortest, fastest course. Winners will compete in Miami Dade County Youth Fair and the Florida Skills USA robotics competitions.

AN ART GALLERY FOR THE MIAMI DESIGN DISTRICT

This project stems from an invitation by local art collectors for senior architecture students to contribute their designs for a new art museum to be built in Miami's Design District. This remarkable opportunity allows students to participate from scratch in the very specialized process influenced by an internationally known Swiss architecture firm, professional museum curators, and civic planners. Each student will experience the rigorous phases of the design process from research to stakeholder meetings. They will develop sketches, construct 3-D models and blueprints and present their ideas for critique before a jury of professionals. Finally they will give

presentations to community members in an exhibition showcase of all the designs. The lessons learned should provide a huge boost to the participants' careers, as there is no substitute for the real thing.

Students will research solid and hazardous waste disposal and be challenged to propose safe alternatives, creating environmental charts, graphs and reports from their investigations. To prep for the mock trial they will attend an actual environmental crime case at the U.S. Federal Courthouse in Miami. Each student will assume an active role in the trial as judges, prosecutors, defendants, plaintiffs, and jury.

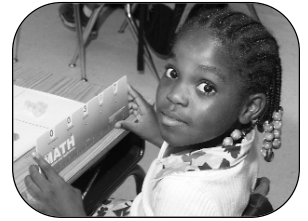

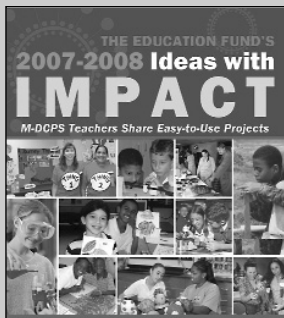
