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## **Project Description**

#### What is an ORR?

An *Oral Reading Recording* – an *ORR* - is a way to *benchmark* students' *oral reading* at the beginning of the school year and then again at the *end of each quarter*.

#### Who is this project designed for?

- English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) (K-12)
- World Languages (K-12)
- English Language Arts/Reading (K-5)
- Intensive Reading (6-12)

#### How does it work?

- 1. Teacher assigns a reading passage.
- 2. Std logs into Microsoft Class Notebook. Opens assignment.
- 3. *Student reads the passage a*loud using a special headset that's connected to his/her device. The system creates an *audio file*. s
- 4. The audio file can be used for *self-assessment* and other purposes.

#### What do you and your students need to get started?

- 1. A device. (Desktop, laptop or tablet)
- 2. Microsoft Office 365.
  - i. Every teacher and student have free access.
  - ii. Use the *Class Notebook* app
- 3. A *headset* with built-in microphone.
- 4. A reading *passage*.

#### How much will this cost to implement?

If you have the proper headsets for your devices - and enough of them - then nothing. On the other hand, if you need to invest in some, ask for \$125. That will get you about ten to get started.

# **Goals and Objectives**

## **Goals**

- 1. To improve reading achievement in students.
- 2. To improve oral reading fluency in students.
- 3. To promote student ownership and responsibility over their learning.

## **Objectives**

- 1. Students will make **observable** gains in **oral reading fluency** every academic **quarter** of the year, based on:
  - a. WPM (Words Per Minute) increases in timed readings.
  - b. Prosody
    - i. Using pitch, stress and timing to convey meaning.
  - c. Speaking Skills
    - i. Pronouncing new or difficult words.
    - *ii.* Clarity Projecting your voice.
    - iii. Phrases Mastering common ones.
- 2. Students will *accurately self-assess* their performance on an oral reading benchmark recording.
  - *a. They will listen to themselves reading aloud and determine* if their performance was as good, better or worse than previous ones.
- 3. Students will become adept at using tech-based learning tools.

# **Implementation Guide**

## **Preparation**

- 1. Grouping charts
- 2. WPM chart
  - a. Show student where he is and where he needs to be
  - b. Available online
- 3. Reading passage
  - a. Benchmark passage (same)
  - b. New one every quarter (different)
- 4. Make time in your calendar
- 5. Systems check
  - a. Hardware: headset and device
  - b. Software: Class NB set up and working

## **During, THE STUDENT WILL:**

- 1. Read the passage out loud as she/he records it (creates an audio file).
- 2. Play back the audio to listen to him/herself.
- 3. The student can record and listen to as many attempts as she/he wants.

### Assessment

The teacher will *REVIEW STUDENT WORK* in *CLASS NOTEBOOK* and provide specific feedback to the student. The audio files and teacher feedback are strong evidence of teaching and learning taking place in your classroom.

After the student listens to the recording, she/he will note in writing (same Class Notebook page) if the performance was as good, better or worse than her previous recording.

## **Commentary**

That's basically it. How often is up to the teacher. The most natural setting for an ORR might be a language or an intensive reading class, but ORRs can be used to increase ELL participation in classes like math and science.
